Everyday miracles

You look up for a moment from whatever it is you're doing and you watch her changing your daughter's diaper. As she rubs the baby with powder, she wiggles her nose against the baby's, and both mom and baby giggle in delight. You file this image away in the place in your heart where you store such visions - visions of everyday "miracles."

Early on you realized that your favorite place on earth is . . . the earth. Whether a few oversize pots on the porch of your first apartment or the garden you sectioned off in the yard behind your present house, you find great fulfillment in making things grow - and the best part is sharing the bounty with those you love: flowers for her, corn for the kids, tomatoes and carrots for the parish food pantry. The good earth is filled with such miracles.

There are so many demands on your time. If nothing else, you could use those few hours to get a head start on the week's projects and maybe get an extra hour or two of sleep some night as a result. But you keep that afternoon or evening free to tutor struggling students at the community center or be part of the crew at the soup kitchen or coach your child's soccer team. To be sure, many people appreciate the time you give - but you know that it's good for you, now and then, to stretch your soul to work a miracle.

Today's Gospel is about those everyday miracles we can work if we possess "mustard seed" faith: the conviction that, in the smallest acts of compassion and generosity, we can transform the most barren stretches of our lives into great gardens of hope and possibility. We may have little or no expectation of a harvest; nurturing what we have planted may be a frustrating and futile undertaking - but Christ calls us to embrace the faith of the Gospel farmer and the hope of the mustard seed: to be willing to plant whatever "seeds" of Gospel hope and compassion that we possess, wherever and whenever we can, in the certain knowledge that it will, in some way, result in its own "miracle": the revelation of the Kingdom of God in the midst of the blessedness of our everyday lives.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS: We have stated previously that St. Paul had a way with words. He was able to take a very complex concept and summarize it in a few words and phrases. In today's Second Reading from Second Corinthians, Paul says simply, "... we walk by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5: 7) That statement by Paul has inspired hymns and treatises.

Yet, it is in reality what we are all about as Catholics and Christians. There is no question that it is one of the most difficult notions for us as Catholics and Christians to grasp and accept. The word translated as "walk" can also be translated as "live." Thus, we could say "We live by faith, and not by sight." This was a popular and consistent theme for St. Paul. his point being that we need to build our lives around the eternal prospects, not those of this world. In this society "things" seem so important to us. However, the truth is that they have no eternal significance. That is an ongoing message in the concept of stewardship - basically who we are and how we live is more important than what we own and what we may appear to be. That can be tough for us. The late Billy Graham, who died earlier this year, was fond of saying, "My home is in Heaven. I am just traveling through this world." St. Paul would agree with that attitude.

"I think this is truly the most wonderful experience we can have: to belong to a people walking, journeying through history together with our Lord, who walks among us! We are not alone; we do not walk alone. We are part of the one flock of Christ that walks together." ~ Pope Francis
